

Little Ewe

Knitting Pattern by Teresa Murray

Supplies:

- small amount of scrap yarn, bulky weight
- Size 9 US knitting needles
- 1.5" square of felt
- Glue or needle & thread
- Darning needle or crochet hook **Glossary:**

KFB - knit front and back to increase by one stitch K2tog - knit 2 stitches together to decrease by one

Instructions:

Makes one adorable Little Ewe approximately 3"

Cast on 6 stitches

Row 1: knit across

Row 2: KFB, knit to end of row


Repeat Row 2 until you have 10 stitches

Knit the next several rows until it measures approximately 2" from the bottom

Next row: K2tog, Knit to end of row

Repeat until you have 6 stitches left

Knit 1 more row, bind off. Use your darning needle or crochet hook to weave in loose ends



Cut the felt as indicated in the diagram at left, trim corners as needed Glue or sew face and legs in place

This pattern is easily adaptable to different weight yarn or needles
